As the Regional Hydrologist, you will be an expert in the field of hydrology, understanding the dynamics of the West Coast Region's varied watersheds. In this important role, you will have the opportunity to provide professional and science-based advice into the development of standards and best management practices and provide advice and recommendations on a number of hydrological topics. If you have the expertise, enjoy a challenge, and thrive in a team-based environment, we encourage you to apply.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Degree in a related field (e.g., Physical Geography, Earth Science, or Environmental Science), or equivalent as accepted by the appropriate professional association.
- Registered or immediately eligible for registration as a fully licensed professional with the British Columbia professional association as required by the specialty area (i.e.: Association of Forest Professionals, Institute of Agrologists, Engineers & Geoscientists of B.C.).
- Experience in watershed hydrology, geomorphology, engineering hydrology, resource management and planning; or experience in applied water resources, hydrology and/or fluvial geomorphology with specific experience in field and stream-based assessments.
- Experience in establishing stream monitoring stations (i.e.: site location, instrumentation installation, and determination of rating curve).
- Experience in stream, river and lake hydraulics and the assessing the potential impacts to resource values from development proposals and activities.
- Experience interpreting and analyzing maps and data related to resource and water management.
- Experience producing technical reports.
